

Online Learning: An Introduction

Welcome to online home learning for pupils in Reception (EYFS) at Beacon View Primary Academy. Now that many of our pupils are isolating and we are abiding by the Government's requests to stay at home, we have looked at how we can continue to support your child with not only their academic learning, but their social and emotional development at this time.

For pupils in Reception (EYFS), a weekly Sway will be published on the school website. In this Sway, the children will receive a weekly message as well as Maths, English, Reading and other curriculum activities. For any children who do not have access to the online materials, alternative provision will be provided in the form of paper packs that you can collect from the school once a week. Further details about these will come out soon to those families who have told us their children cannot access the internet at home.

We hope that by taking this personalised approach to your child's learning, we will continue to support them in being the best that they can be.

Online Learning: In Summary

Where can my child access their home learning activities?

By visiting the Home Learning section of the school website.

When will they be available?

Easter-related Sways with activities will be uploaded on Friday (3.4.2020) and then weekly Maths and English Sways will be uploaded in the Home Learning section of the school website on a Monday morning (from 20.4.2020).

How will the materials be produced and shared?

The Reception teachers will produce learning activities for your child based on the curriculum they have covered this year and the needs of your child. These will then be added to a weekly Sway, uploaded and shared by a member of the Reception Team.



Using Sway from the School Website







On a Monday, all of your child's work for the week will be added to a Sway and published on the school website.

This Sway will not require your child or yourself to log in to view it and it might be something you or they wish to use to help recap their learning journey during this period when we are not at school.

Each section, will take your child to their different subject learning areas and activities.

We will also use the Sways to celebrate achievements or pieces of work throughout the week so please do continue to share your child's achievements (both academic and social) on Tapestry with us so that we can celebrate their successes.




Completing and Submitting Work

There are many ways and functions for your child to complete and submit their work via the Sway, however for now we are asking them to use these options below. It is not expected for your child to send their work to their teacher, however the teachers are more than happy to answer any questions and support your child's learning where they can. Work will not be marked however where possible, answers will be shared to allow your child to self assess their own learning and use the reflective skills we've developed in class.

Option 1: Completing Offline

- ✓ Viewing the work online
- ✓ Write the answers on paper
- ✓ Photograph the answers and share with your child's class teacher by email or Tapestry.






Option 2: Completing and Submitting by Email

✓ Children can send their answers by writing an email to their class teacher

Option 3: Completing Online

✓ If your child has access to Word or the One Drive Apps, they can complete their work online and then share directly with their teacher (more guides for this option will be created soon).
