Sports for Schools

Defibrillator

As part of the DFE programme, we now have a defibrillator in school. This is kept in main reception and can be accessed if needed. We have also registered it with



The Circuit, a charity who work with the emergency services so that if someone calls for an ambulance and the person needs a defib they can direct them to the nearest one. We hope to never need it, however it is handy knowing that we have it there if we need it.

Stomp to School

Children can earn fantastic rewards for their class and for the school by stomping - walking, cycling, wheeling or scooting - to school during the Pompey Monster Stomp to School Challenge

To take part children simply need to walk, cycle, wheel or scoot to school between Monday 5 June and Friday 14 July and record their stomps in the Go Jauntly app.

The Pompey Monster Stomp to School Challenge encourages friendly competition between classes, and with other schools, while helping to keep our roads safer and our air cleaner.

To help motivate children during the challenge, they are encouraged by Stomper, the leader of the Pompey Monsters, to stomp as much as they can on their way to and from school. Every stomp counts, since classes will compete with each other for extra playtime. All the children's combined total stomps add up as they compete against St Paul's for the chance to win the top prize - an exclusive BMX show for the school, or a great runner-up prize, new scooter parking!

As well as encouraging children to be more active, the challenge helps to reduce the number of children being dropped off and collected by car. This helps to keep the school gates clear of vehicles, improves road safety, and helps to develop cleaner air for the health of the whole school community and our neighbours. Parents and carers who need to drive can park and stride. Parking a short distance away allows children to stomp at least some of the way, and every stomp counts!

SEND - Did You know?

Dyslexia

Dyslexia is a learning difficulty which primarily affects reading and writing skills. However, it does not only affect these skills.

Dyslexia is actually about information processing.

Dyslexic people may have **difficulty** processing and remembering information they see and hear, which can affect learning and the acquisition of literacy skills.

Dyslexia can also impact on other areas such as **organisational skills**.

It is important to remember that there are positives to thinking differently. Many dyslexic people show **strengths** in areas such as reasoning and in visual and creative fields.

School cannot diagnose dyslexia. This can only be done by an educational psychologist or a specialist dyslexia teacher. However, we can screen children to get an indication of whether they have possible dyslexic difficulties.
