

Behaviour Review

Following on from our parent and pupil survey, we are making some tweaks to our behaviour policy and introducing some new strategies.

We are delighted to introduce the Values Superheroes Passport ('BV Great 8'). Children will work through four different levels, Bronze, Silver, Gold and Diamond. At the end of each level, pupils will receive a certificate and a wristband to bring home and recognition in assembly. To achieve a level, children need to show evidence of meeting the 8 UL and BV values: **Respect**, **Responsibility**, **Resilience**, **Ambition**, **Creativity**, **Determination**, **Enthusiasm** and **Confidence**.

We really hope this will be an excellent incentive for all children to work towards and great recognition for pupils who make good choices every day.

As with any school, there can be a very small number of children whose behaviour can be disruptive. We are therefore going to be introducing the **Reset Room**. This will be a special area where pupils who are struggling can reset and complete their work so that the rest of our pupils can focus without disruption. We will continue to work with individual parents where behavior is a concern.
