


Beacon View Primary News

The greeting your child receives when they arrive in school is really important, therefore please don't be offended if your child is greeted first, before you on the classroom doors.

If your child is on the play equipment before school, you must supervise them. They are not supervised by the school until they walk through the doors at 08.38 am.

Please ensure you are keeping your children safe.

Uniform

It is essential that all children are in the proper school uniform. For this week only, ALL children can wear PE kit, due to the extreme temperatures. This must be a plain white t-shirt with dark coloured shorts, track suit bottoms or leggings and any colour trainers. If your child prefers to wear their normal uniform, this is also okay. Only dark blue tops with the logo or a logo badge should be worn with this, if needed. If your child needs something different due to SEND, this needs to have been discussed with Rosie Higson, SENCo prior to any changes.

Snack will be provided during sessions, however children need to have had breakfast or lunch before they arrive. Only children who are in all day will have a lunch in school. These need to be paid for via Arbor, if your child is not Free School Meals (benefits related).

If your child is in Year 5 or 6, they can have your permission to walk to and from school without an adult. Please read the letter attached carefully and return the form if you would like this to happen. Each year we start afresh with this form to ensure that we are all safeguarding the children.

You will have seen emails and Facebook info about Taylor Shaw, our new caterers. The menus are up on the school website





Wrap around care

Breakfast and afterschool club has moved to the ground floor. Please come through the Marsden Road gate and then press the button on the next gate, you will be connected to the Family room and buzzed in. Please do not let anyone else in through the gate. Please book your children in for sessions through Arbor Pay and ensure you have enough credit on the account. The money will be taken when the register is completed. If you don't have credit, you will be contacted and we won't be able to take further bookings until you have paid your account.

Extra-curricular clubs

These will start on Wednesday 13th September and we will be using Arbor to book these sessions. Please be aware that we will be operating a red card warning system for behaviour in all clubs, this should ensure that everyone can enjoy the experience of these clubs without interruption. All those who get accepted into clubs will receive a letter explaining this.
