SEND - Did You know?

There are four broad areas of need for SEND:

Communication and Interaction

This includes autism, and speech and language difficulties.

Cognition and Learning

Where children have difficulties with literacy and numeracy or if their levels of attainment are significantly below age-related expectations. This includes specific learning difficulties, moderate learning difficulties, severe learning difficulties and profound and multiple learning difficulties.

Social, Emotional and Mental Health difficulties

Children with SEMH can display signs of this in a variety of different ways, some may be withdrawn and prefer to be alone or show signs of anxiety, whilst others may be hyperactive and find it difficult when concentrating on tasks.

Physical and/or Sensory Needs

Examples of sensory and physical needs include: hearing impairment, visual impairment, and sensory processing difficulties.

Many children and young people have difficulties that fit clearly into one of these areas; some have needs that span two or more areas.
