

Curriculum Overview


- Recapping previous learning from all of KS2.

- **Geography:** improving the environment; comparison of environments; geographical fieldwork.
- R.E.: Theology (Christianity); Social Sciences (Hindu Dharma/festivals and pilgrimage); Philosophy.
- **D&T:** textiles; sustainable systems; cooking and nutrition.
- **Art & design:** recycled materials; displacement; global connections.
- Music: Keyboards after Christmas (children will need headphones from home for this).





Being Secondary Ready

SATs

Achieving the expected standard in all 3 of Reading, Writing and Maths means that your child will be able to access the KS3 curriculum and be on a trajectory for further success.

Attendance and Behaviour

Establishing the right habits, for example being at school, on time, every day, and following the school's behaviour expectations will ensure that your child develops the independence and selfdiscipline needed for Y7.



Attendance

- Every child is entitled to a good quality education in this country, they are entitled to be in school every day.
- It is your right as their adults to have the support you need from us to enable this to happen.
- We have a legal obligation to follow up on attendance, to ensure that you are getting the support you are entitled to and that your children are getting the education they are entitled to.





Year 6 SATs

- Children will be sitting their SATs in May (Monday 11th Thursday 14th 2026).
- Statutory requirement from the government.
- Preparation happens in all lessons for the whole year
- We provide lots of extra support e.g keeping children and parents informed of how well they are doing, small group and individual support, tailored homework.






Year 6 SATs

Each child will be required to sit six papers:

- Grammar, spelling and punctuation paper
- Spelling test
- Reading comprehension
- Arithmetic paper
- Two maths reasoning (word problem) papers

Writing remains teacher assessed.








Year 6 SATs

- Past papers once a half term focus on format and different test techniques.
- Mock SATs week so that children know exactly how it will run.
- Results are issued in July with end of year report.
- Information will be passed onto secondary schools, however, children tend to be retested by their new schools.



Year 6 Pupil Passports



Parent Guide to Pupil Passports What is a Pupil Passport?

A **Pupil Passport** is a personalised booklet your child will use throughout Year 6 to track their progress in key assessments. It helps them take ownership of their learning, set goals, and reflect on their achievements. It also provides a structured way for teachers and school leaders to support your child through regular 1:1 meetings.



Year 6 Pupil Passports

Why Are Pupil Passports Important?

Empowers your child to understand their strengths and areas for improvement.

Encourages goal-setting and personal responsibility.

Builds confidence through regular, supportive conversations with staff.

Keeps you informed about your child's progress and how you can help at home.

What's Inside the Passport?

The passport is a folded A4 booklet with the following sections:

Front Cover

Pupil's name and class

Assessment Pages

There are four key data points recorded:

Year 5 End-of-Year Assessment

November Mock SATs

March Mock SATs

Final KS2 SATs Results

Each page includes:

Raw Score and Scaled Score for Reading, Maths, Writing and SPaG

Personal targets set by your child

Signatures from pupil and staff



Year 6 Pupil Passports

How Does It Work?

At each assessment point:

Your child will have a 1:1 meeting with their class teacher, phase leader, or headteacher

They will review their scores and discuss what went well and what could be improved.

They will set **four realistic targets** to work on before the next assessment.

These meetings help your child feel valued, supported, and motivated.

How Are Parents Involved?

You will be invited to a **Secondary Ready Meeting**.

All assessment results will be explained clearly.

Your child's passport will be shared with you.

You'll receive guidance on how to support your child's targets at home.

This partnership between school and home is key to helping your child succeed.




Top Tips for Supporting Your Child at Home

Here are some practical ways you can help your child achieve their targets:

- **Practice Times Tables Regularly** Quick recall of multiplication facts supports maths fluency and confidence.
- **Support Weekly Spellings** Encourage your child to use new words in sentences and spot them in books.
- **Complete Homework Together** Create a calm space and routine for homework. Praise effort, not just results.
- **Use Online Learning Platforms** Make use of school-recommended apps like Times Tables Rockstars, Spelling Shed, or SATs Companion.
- **Read Daily** Reading improves vocabulary, comprehension, and writing skills. Ask questions about what they've read.
- **Attend Parent Evenings and Meetings** Stay informed about your child's progress and ask how you can help at home.
- **Celebrate Progress** Recognise small wins and improvements to keep your child motivated.
- **Talk About Targets** Ask your child what they're working on and how they feel about their learning.

Home Learning Expectations

- Home learning each week
 - 15 minutes of Bedrock
 - 15 minutes of TTRS
 - Conquer Maths, which is set by the teacher
 - 10 minutes of reading at least 3x per week.
- Homework embeds our learning in school and is crucial to keep key skills sharp.
- In Year 6, we reward children every week if they complete all their homework. These rewards range from dodgeball, outside play, movie, colouring club, free time and children's suggestions.



How you can help...

- Read every day with your child.
- Assist with homework if necessary (refer to our policies online).
- Go over CGP answers and provide feedback to teacher if necessary.
- Help them to establish a routine and develop ownership of this as the year goes on (e.g. homework first <u>then</u> TV/gaming).
- Encourage independence.
- Routine time management, relaxation etc.




Smart Uniform Expectations


