


Please take time to read this newsletter which has lots of ways in which we can work together to further develop our offer to families in Paulsgrove.



As you know all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 get free meals in school as part of the government commitment. If you are also eligible for free school meals due to benefits, please, please, please apply for these too. Each



child who gets benefits-related free school meals bring an additional £1,455 into the school, this enables us to employ additional staff to support the children and to pay towards things like trips and experiences.
