Return to school

School Starts at 8:40am Please can I remind all adults that the school gates don't open until 08.30 am in a morning. The children should be arriving at or after this time, especially if they have permission to travel to school on their own as there is no one to supervise them prior to the school doors opening at 08.38 am. School finishes at 3:15pm

Christmas Presents

We know that some children will be lucky enough to get phones and phone linked watches for Christmas this year. Please can we remind you that only those children who have forms completed to walk to school alone should need to bring a phone to school. These phones need to be switched off when they arrive at school and to be given to the class teacher for storage through the day.

Smart watches that link to phones should not be worn to school. Whilst many of these have a school mode, these do not stop the child from using them to make calls or send messages so even with these settings they are still not able to wear these to school. All classrooms in the school have a working clock at the front of the room so that children can see the time.

Year 3 Swimming

Year 3 will begin their swimming lessons on Wednesday 11th January 2023. This week you will receive more information about this. Please ensure that your child has a swimming costume (one piece, not bikinis) and a towel ready for this.
